## WHAT IS ROTARY

Rotary is a service organization of business and professional leaders united worldwide who conduct humanitarian projects, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations, and work to promote international understanding and world peace.

Established in Chicago in 1905 by Paul Harris, Rotary is the first and most international of all service clubs. As of February 2003 Rotary has over 1.24 million service-minded members in over 31,000 clubs in 164 countries.

Rotary first came to Arizona in 1914 with the establishment of the world's 100<sup>th</sup> club – the Rotary Club of Phoenix. Arizona now boasts three Rotary districts composed of more than 5000 Rotarians in over 40 clubs.

## THE OBJECT OF ROTARY

The object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

- High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying by Rotarians of their occupations as opportunities to serve society.
- The advancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional people united in the ideal of service.
- The development of acquaintances as an opportunity for service.
- The application of the ideal of service to their personal, business and community life.

## FOUR PEAKS ROTARY CLUB

The Four Peaks Rotary Club was chartered on May 18, 1997. Our club was sponsored by the noon Fountain Hills Rotary Club after it was determined Rotary could be better served and represented by the addition of a local morning club. The nucleus of the club was formed in the winter of 1996 and eventually chartered with 23 members. The club's first mission statement was to make a commitment to focus on service the local community and youth.

Acquaintance and fellowship are important facets of the Four Peaks Club. Our membership is composed of fun loving, service minded men and women who willingly give their time and energy to the Rotary motto "Service Above Self".
